Patrick was a Lecturer in International Relations at Pembroke College, University of Oxford from 2006 to 2008 and has worked on development policy for CARE Canada at both headquarters and in the organization's Zambia country office. Patrick has conducted policy analysis on a consultancy basis for the Global Centre for Pluralism, the Canadian Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade, and Development, Oxford Analytica, and the Trudeau Foundation.
