In 2007, he launched Dalberg’s presence in Africa, which grew to become the Group’s largest business unit. As Executive Director, he currently leads integration and innovation across Dalberg’s five core businesses, which together employ over 600 staff in 25 locations across the globe, including 11 countries in Africa.

He currently serves on a number of boards including Old Mutual Limited, the Skoll Foundation and One Acre Fund.
